

Scrappy Little Sweater – Supply List

Pattern:

Please refer to the Kingston Sweater pattern for all materials. For this sweater, it's suggested to buy at least one or two skeins of super bulky yarn (suggested yarns below in materials list) for the neck and underarm for maximum comfort.

For the majority of the sweater, we'll use thrifted yarn of all weights to keep the sweater cost-effective. Bring as many skeins as you can find of various weights, the chunkier the better. It is so fun to collect yarn at thrift stores and garage sales. I'll show you how to use those yarns to create a super bulky weight yarn and "paint" with yarn!

This sweater pattern is highly modifiable and can be turned into a longer dress or cropped sweater. Sleeves can be shorter or longer, tapered or not tapered with cuffs or no cuffs.

Materials:

- Kingston Sweater pattern by Tara-Lynn Morrison (\$6.50 on Ravelry)
- Circular needles:
 - 13 US / 9 mm circulars 16" / 41 cm around
 - 15 US / 10 mm circulars 24" / 61 cm around
 - 19 US / 15 mm circulars 24" / 61 cm around
 - 19 US / 15 mm circulars, 32" / 80 cm around (optional longer length)
- Yarn - amount based on size of sweater to knit (refer to pattern and also touch base with your local yarn store if needed for help with sizing and amounts of yarn to match size desired)
- Suggested Super Bulky Yarns:
 - Rowan Big Wool
 - Lion Brand Wool Ease Thick & Quick Solids
 - Cascade Yarns® Magnum
 - Malabrigo Yarn Rasta
 - Wool and the Gang Crazy Sexy Wool
 - madelinetosh A.S.A.P
 - Westlake Glacier Merino Super Bulky
 - 2 stitch holders for separating sleeves
 - Jumbo stitch markers for size 19 needles (recommended: Chiao Goo)
 - Small knitting scissors
 - Tapestry needle
 - Crochet hook
 - Gentle fiber wash (recommended: Soak)
 - Row counter (optional)
 - Sweater drying rack (optional)
